



## School Profile 2023-2024

Tilatá is an independent, co-educational, bilingual (Spanish-English) school founded in 1992 under the conviction that developing every student's unique potential will contribute significantly to the transformation of the world. Tilatá offers the tools and experiences for the mind, body, and spirit of its students to flourish in a balanced manner. It teaches them to understand that they are unique, yet part of an ecosystem where their actions have an impact on others and their shared environment. There is a current enrollment of approximately 550 students; and a structure of 24 students per classroom, 2 classrooms per grade level. The rate of students per teacher is 8:1. Tilatá is an IBO School, authorized for the Primary Years (PYP), Middle Years (MYP) and Diploma (DP) Programmes. It is also part of the Union of International Schools (UNCOLI) and has been recognized and certified by the EFQM model of excellence. It has been recognized as one of Colombia's 6 Ashoka Changemaker Schools.

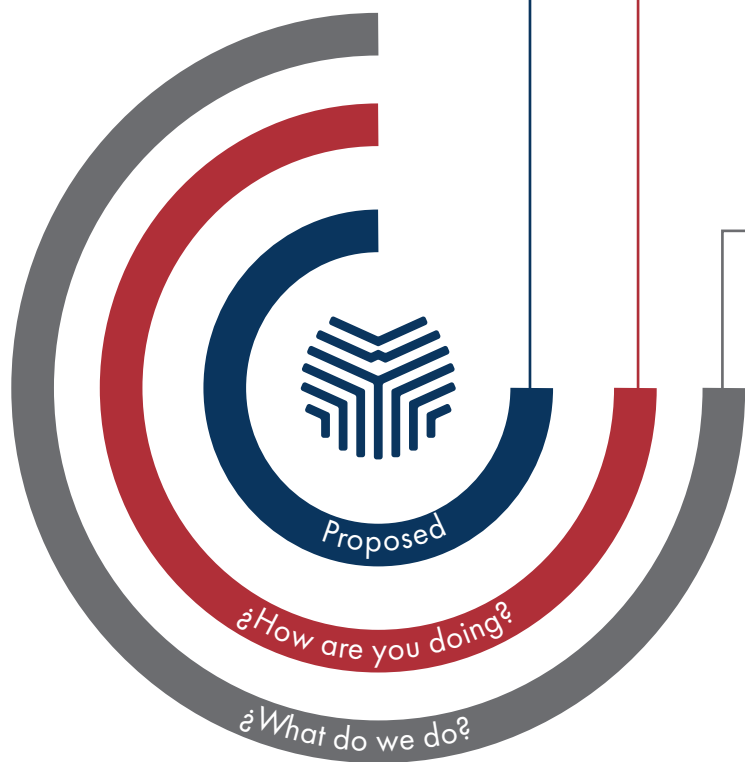


Transforming education to contribute to a better version of our world.

# Evaluation System

## Middle School-MYP


In Middle School which includes grades Sixth to Ninth, each subject has four learning objectives that are assessed based on the evaluation criteria previously established for each of them. Each criterion defines the level of performance of the student with an assessment scale from 1 to 8. The annual final grade for the course is defined through a grade band with a scale of 1 to 7 according to the IB Middle Years Program evaluation system.

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# Evaluation System

## High School-DP

In Tilatá's High School, a section that includes grades Tenth and Eleventh, all subjects are assessed through the "Assessment Component" of the Diploma Programme (DP). Each Assessment Component receives only one grade according to the evaluation parameters of each subject. Likewise, each student receives a single final grade for each subject studied. The grading scale in High School is between 7 (maximum) and 1 (minimum), with 4 being the minimum passing grade.
